A small group of selected students will study Separate Sciences. These courses will cover more content, and at a faster pace. Students will be expected to consolidate their understanding through extra home learning and independent revision.

The government's ambition is to see $90 \%$ of pupils studying the EBacc subject combination at GCSE by 2025

-Geography or History

## Why study a MFL at GCSE?

Spanish is a global language and is the official language in 20 countries. It is spoken throughout South America, and on many island such as the Balearics and the Canaries.

It is also the second most native spoken language globally, only behind Mandarin Chinese, which has roughly 955 million speakers.

## Non-exam assessment (NEA)

The term 'non-exam assessment' covers a range of different forms of assessment.

Non-exam assessments are not necessarily 'internally' or teacher-marked nor undertaken over an extended period of time. A performance may, for example, be undertaken under timed conditions and marked by a visiting exam board assessor.

Will all GCSEs have non-exam assessment?
No. The percentage depends on the range of skills to be assessed and the most effective way of assessing them.
